Activity busses are provided Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday for students who live within the Anthony attendance area. Students must have permission and be participating in an activity to ride the bus. Students must be in a class to be placed on the bus list for that day. ***We make every effort to drop students at their usual stop. Secondary students may be required to walk up to 6 blocks according to district transportation policy.***

After school classes may be cancelled for a variety of reasons including inclement weather or teacher illness. If a class is cancelled kids will be notified by a PA announcement and will be expected to ride the regular bus at 4:00. It can be dangerous for a student to arrive home unexpectedly and not be able to get into his/her home. Please have a plan in place for severe weather or cancellations.

Students staying in the building after school hours must be registered. All students must be in classrooms by 3:55. After school classes are dismissed at 5:20. Busses load at 5:25. All students including walkers, bus riders and those who are picked up, must be out of the building by 5:25.

*We expect the same high standard of behavior for after school activities as kids observe during the day. All Anthony Middle School rules apply to after school activities.*

#### **Minneapolis Public Schools Community Education Discipline Policy**

Participating in after school programs is an opportunity that is extended to the youth of Minneapolis. All after school programs conform to the established behavior policies of **Anthony Middle School** and the Citywide Discipline policy of the Minneapolis Public Schools. Students are expected to behave appropriately both during the program and the bus ride home. A student may be asked to take a “time out” from an activity if he or she is misbehaving or acting inappropriately. If the problem is severe or persistent (continuing after warning(s) have been given) a note will be sent home with the student and he or she will not be allowed to participate until the note is signed by a parent or guardian and returned to the Community Education office, or until other arrangements are made including the possibility of suspension, in-school suspension, parent conference or loss of after school privileges. If a student is suspended from school they will not be allowed to participate in after school programs during their suspension. Parents are usually notified by phone if we are having problems with their child.

#### **After School Behavior Policy**

All children participating in the after school program are expected to follow the rules for behavior when in class or on the bus. All students are given three chances. First referral, we will speak to student. Second referral, we will talk to student along with a call to the parent/guardian. Third referral, they will be removed from the program or bus depending on reason for referrals. Depending on the reason for referral, a student may receive two or three strikes on the first referral.

**MPS SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES ARE NOT AVAILABLE DURING AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS.** After school programming is not linked with the school health services office. It does not have access to school records (medical information, health plans, IEPs, Section 504 plans, etc.). Parents/guardians are responsible for notifying the On-site Coordinator of any special needs or medical conditions that impact their child’s health, well-being, or involvement in activities. A conference with the family may be requested in order to determine what reasonable accommodations should be provided. If prescribed or over-the-counter medication must be given while a child is attending after school programming, parents/guardians must complete an authorization form before any medicine will be dispensed. Medication must be in its original packaging or prescription bottle. All medication will be stored on-site in a locked cabinet. *Medication is not accessible from the school nurse’s office.*

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
