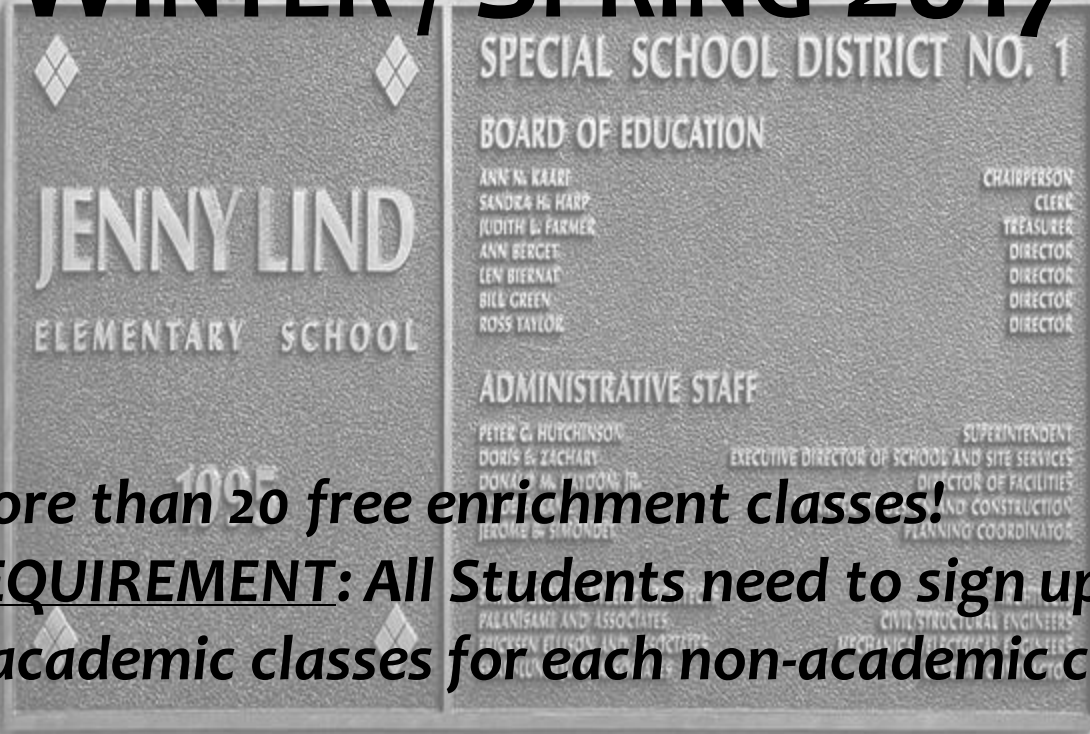

After School begins at 3:00. Parent Pickup and Walkers leave at 4:50 and busses depart at 5:00pm.

There will be no After School Activities on the following dates:

- January 30th (Staff Professional Development Day)
- February 17 & 20th (Conferences and Presidents Day)
- March 31st – April 7th (Spring Break)

Registration and Confirmation:

Students in ALC, ACES, GISE, and GEMS will continue in those classes the whole year. Your child may not get his/her first choice activity. If your child gets no activities, he or she will be put on a waiting list and added as space becomes available. Many classes are two days a week and students must attend both. Keep this in mind while registering for other classes. Children invited to ALC academic classes will work on grade-level material and be enrolled through a separate form. These children have been pre-selected by their classroom teacher based on academic need.

We will send home a confirmation letter when your child is officially enrolled and set up with transportation: This letter will include your child's class schedule and transportation. Do not send your child to activities unless s/he has received a confirmation. Sometimes it takes weeks for bus stops to be routed by district transportation. Classroom teachers will have a list of students who can remain for after school and this list is updated weekly.

If your child will be picked up from After School programs, please arrive at 4:50 pm:

Come prepared to show ID. If you want to add someone as a trusted adult to pick up your child, send a written note to the office. Please honor the time and work of our teachers and wait until dismissal to pick up children so they don't lose valuable time in class.

A written note or phone call by 2:00pm by a parent or guardian is required:

- If your child has moved and needs a new bus stop;
- If your child's schedule changes and she or he will miss After School that day;
- Someone not on your list of people who pick up your child will be picking them up that day;
- If you want to UN-enroll your child in After School.

Snacks:

Snacks are provided free for all program participants. We receive our snacks through MPS Nutrition Services and all snacks are peanut-free. Please any food allergies or restrictions your child may have on their registration form.
