Student Behavior

In order to promote a safe and engaging environment, Community Education, Youth Enrichment, a program of Minneapolis Public Schools, conforms to the established behavior policies of the school site and the Minneapolis Public Schools Behavior Standards and Code of Conduct (P5200). After School Activities Cancellation

***When after school classes are cancelled your child will be sent home on their regular bus at 3:25pm. If you pick up your child you will need to be here by 3:20pm at door #1.** It is very dangerous for a young child to arrive home unexpectedly and not be able to get into his/her home or be at home without supervision. Please have a plan in place for severe weather or cancellations.

MONDAY

MATH and READING Support through Social Emotional Learning (ALC) (Gr. K-1) If you want your student to improve their literacy and math skills, this is the class for you. Students will work in small groups with guided support from a classroom teacher on skills being addressed in their daytime class. Students will also work independently on maintaining their literacy and foundational math skills. This will be done through the lens of Social Emotional Learning. This class meets on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday for the school year. Instructor: Mark. Free

TIGER CUBS for Girls & Boys (Gr. K-2) From construction projects to capture the flag, from camping gear to fire fighters, Tiger Cubs explore various facets of life through hands-on activities, science projects, arts and crafts, and outdoor games designed to engage, enrich, and excite. Come join the adventure! Free

ANIMAL KINGDOM (Gr. K-3) Investigate and learn about your favorite animals by watching videos, doing in-depth projects, and discovering fun facts about all kinds of creatures. If you are an animal lover, this class is for you. Instructor: Rose Fee: \$30

Little GEMS/GISE (ALC) (Gr. K-3) In this exciting robotics class students learn mechanical design, construction, programming, and teamwork skills In pairs, using LEGO building elements, motors, and sensors, students build different robot prototypes and program them with a computer to move, react, and make sounds. Students will participate in the 2018 Robotics FIRST Lego League Challenge: HYDRO DYNAMICSSM. The students will learn all about water- how to find, transport, use, or dispose of it. The culminating event for this class is the STEM-GEMS-GISE /Minneapolis FLL Regional Robotics Exhibition & Tournament on January 27, 2018. Class meets on Monday and Wednesday for the school year. SHOPKINS CUTE with Kidcreate Studio (K-4) Come and create the most delicious (and cute) art projects you can imagine. We will learn step-by-step drawing and sculpting techniques as we create Melonie Pips, D’lish Donut, Berry Smoothie and more of your favorite Shopkins characters. This will be done through the lens of Social Emotional Learning. You may choose to come one, two or all three days. This is a yearlong class. Instructor: Sara Free

IMPROV (Gr. 2-5) Explore the exciting and creative “anything can happen” world of improvisation acting. Have a blast in this script-free, think-on-your-feet class. Improvisation is unique in that the performance will be different every time. Come join in the fun! Instructor: Noah Fee: \$30

LITERACY MATTERS (Gr. 2-5) Y Mentors engage their mentees in literacy practices that work to improve reading attitudes in fun and creative ways (i.e. creating a group cookbook, inventing games with written instructions, reading about local, national and international heroes and heroines). Y Mentors also actively promote healthy choices through implementing and engaging in physical movement-games with added nutritional tips that the mentees can practice in their daily life. Programmatically, college student mentors will strive to incorporate the balance of body, mind, and spirit which directly correlates with academic success and creates a holistic approach within a healthy living program. THE ART OF (e) MOTION (Gr. 3-5) Calling all artists and performers! Beginners KENDAMA CLASS (Gr. 3-8) Kendama is a Japanese game of strategy and focus that helps teach discipline and patience. Learn to catch the tama (ball) from rest and juggle it from cup to cup. It is the perfect way to practice coordination, dexterity and focus. You will master useful techniques, grips, juggling and cool tricks that you can combine in countless ways. Learn with a pro from Sweets Kendamas. Limit: 8 Fee: \$35 (You may purchase a Kendama for \$15 – please bring payment to the first class)

Intermediate/Advance KENDAMA CLASS (Gr. 4-8) Limit: 8 Fee: \$35

GAME CLUB (Gr. 4-8) Come hang out and compete with your friends and play your favorite games. We will play board games, card games, and group games, both old and new! Fee: \$30

GEMS/GISES (ALC) (Gr. 4-8) In this exciting robotics class students learn mechanical design, construction, programming, and teamwork skills. Using LEGO building elements, motors, and sensors, students will build different robot prototypes and program them with computers to move, react, and make sounds. Students will utilize their prototypes and programming to solve design challenges using the LEGO Mindstorms NXT Robotic System or the Lego EV3 Robotic System and will participate in the 2018 Robotics FIRST Lego League Challenge: HYDRO DYNAMICSSM. The students will learn all about water-how to find, transport, use or dispose of it. The culminating event for this class is the STEM-GEMS-GISE /Minneapolis FLL Regional Robotics Tournament on January 27, 2018. Class meets both Mondays and Wednesdays for the school year. Free
