MONDAY

MATH and READING Support through Social Emotional Learning (ALC) (Gr. K-1) If you want to improve your literacy and math skills, then this is the class for you. You will work in small groups with guided support from a classroom teacher on skills that are addressed in your daytime class and work independently on maintaining your literacy and foundational math skills through the lens of Social Emotional Learning. This class meets on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday for the school year. Teacher: Mark Free

TIGER CUBS for Girls & Boys (Gr. K-2) From construction projects to capture the flag, from camping gear to fire fighters, Tiger Cubs explore various facets of life through hands-on activities, science projects, arts and crafts, and outdoor games designed to engage, enrich, and excite. Come join the adventure! Fee: \$5

GEMS/GISE JR. (K-3) In this exciting class you will explore science and math through problem and project-based learning that integrates engineering and technology concepts. The class will meet Mondays and Wednesdays for the entire school year. Instructor is a Minneapolis school teacher Free

INDOOR/OUTDOOR GAMES (Gr. K-3) Have fun with your friends playing a variety of both indoor and outdoor games and sports such as kickball, capture the flag, and tag. Instructors: Savannah & Madeleine Fee: \$35

CHESS CLUB (Gr. K-8) Learn the classic game for the first time or sharpen your skills and improve your strategy and defense moves. Fee: \$35

SCIENCE COMES ALIVE! (Gr. 1-5) Discover how Science Comes Alive with Mad Science! Wonder at the marvels of natural science as you explore how animals adapt to their environments, bugs defend themselves, and life can survive at the bottom of the sea. Discover the secrets of science's impact on the brain through magic tricks and art. Explore chemistry as you figure out the difference between solutions and suspensions and experience the power of chemical reactions. Delve into the science of paleontology and learn about the dinosaurs! And of course, get a great signature Mad Science take-home every day! **(6-week class) Dates: 10/1/18 – 11/12/18** Fee: \$100

Reading, Writing, Arithmetic & Fun through Social Emotional Learning (ALC) (Gr. 2-3) Do you want to improve your skills in reading, writing and math while having fun? Then this is the class for you. We will read books, short stories, poems, and much more. We will work on math skills with games and write to express our feelings and ideas through the lens of Social Emotional Learning. You may choose to come one, two, or all three days. This is a yearlong class. Teacher: Sara Free

LITERACY MATTERS (Gr. 2-5) Y Mentors engage their mentees in literacy practices that work to improve reading attitudes in fun and creative ways (i.e. creating a group cookbook, inventing games with written instructions, reading about local, national, and international heroes and heroines). Y Mentors also actively promotes healthy choices through implementing and engaging in physical games with nutritional tips that the mentees can practice in their daily life. Programmatically, college student mentors will strive to incorporate the balance of body, mind, and spirit that directly correlates with academic success and creates a holistic approach within a healthy living program. SEWING BASICS (Gr. 3-6) You will learn how to use a sewing machine, cut patterns, and create an outfit that's just right for you. You will acquire skills to last a lifetime. Instructor: Candy Fee: \$35

KENDAMA CLASS (Beginners & Advanced Students) (Gr. 3-8) Kendama is a Japanese game of strategy and focus that helps teach discipline and patience. Learn to catch the tama (ball) from rest and juggle it from cup to cup. It is the perfect way to practice coordination, dexterity, and focus. You will master useful techniques, grips, juggling, and cool tricks that you can combine in countless ways. Learn with a pro from Sweets Kendamas. This class is for both beginners and advanced students. Fee: \$35

GIRLS' INC. (Gr. 4-5) Join in the excitement of the YWCA Girls Inc. Program! In this girls only group, you will create change in the community by working with women leaders, mastering fun science experiments, learning about the power of money, and exploring healthy decision making. You will get to interact with their peers during group sessions, attend field trips, and receive a Girls Inc. T-Shirt! GEMS/GISE (ALC) (Gr. 4-8) In this exciting robotics class, you will learn mechanical design, construction, programming, and teamwork skills. You will work in pairs using LEGO building elements, motors, and sensors to build different robot prototypes and program them with a computer to move, react, and make sounds. You will utilize prototypes and programming to solve design challenges using the LEGO Mindstorms NXT Robotic System or the Lego EV3 Robotic System and will participate in the 2019 Robotics FIRST Lego League Challenge: *INTO ORBITSM*. You will also identify a physical or social problem faced by humans during a long duration in space exploration within our Sun's solar system. *The culminating event for this class is the STEM-GEMS-GISE Robotics Exhibition & Minneapolis FLL Regional Robotics Tournament on January 26, 2019.* This is a yearlong class that meets Mon. & Weds.. Free

MIDDLE SCHOOL MENTOR (Gr. 5-8) Would you like to take on a leadership role after school? You can be a mentor to our younger students and help out in other classes. Free

GIRL SCOUTS ConnectZ (Gr. 6-8) Join your friends, old and new, in making ooey and gooey STEM projects like lip balm and slime, building leadership skills, learning about college and careers, and celebrating girl power. You will also play an active and vital role in planning troop activities. Be real, be free, be YOU. Led by Ms. Jinath Free

BOOK CLUB (ALC) (Gr.6-8) Do you love books? Do you wish you had more time to read and discuss books? Do you want to improve your reading skills? Then this is the class for you. Health and Medical

If your child may need to receive either prescribed or over-the counter medications while attending before/after school programming, you must complete an authorization form before medication can be dispensed. **Medication must be in the original packaging or prescription bottle.** All medication will be securely stored on-site.

Student Behavior

In order to promote a safe and engaging environment, Community Education, Youth Enrichment, a program of Minneapolis Public Schools, conforms to the established behavior policies of the school site and the Minneapolis Public Schools Behavior Standards and Code of Conduct (P5200). After School Activities Cancellation

In the event of inclement or severe weather, the district will decide whether to cancel after school programs. In the event of cancellations, your child's school will contact families and notice will be posted on mpls.k12.mn.us.

***When after school classes are cancelled your child will be sent home on their regular bus at 3:25pm. If you pick up your child you will need to be here by 3:20pm at door #1.** It is very dangerous for a young child to arrive home unexpectedly and not be able to get into his/her home or be at home without supervision. Please have a plan in place for severe weather or cancellations.
